## Notes apple inc

Scoring the notes can change the fact that you remember the brilliant idea you came up with in the shower and let it get exhausted. The Apple Notes app has come a long way from being a fake-tampon on paper days stuffed with features to make sure your best brain storms are always within range. Notes helps to take a load from your brain by giving you a convenient way to invade your thoughts, and if you own other Apple devices connected to the same iCloud account, they'll be instantly synced, meaning wherever you go, so too are your notes. The big makeover notes came in iOS 9 and OS X 10.11 El Capitan, and has acquired even newer features since it first came out. We use the latest version of Notes available on iOS 9.3 and OS X 10.11.4. If you don't have any of these versions installed, you won't be able to lock notes, which is a new key feature. How to use OS X Notes is included in OS X, so there's nothing to download or install. If you haven't already pinned it to your Dock, you can open it from the Apps folder or use spotlight. There are three panels of the Notes app: the folder window, your note list, and the contents of the note, so when you click a note, you see the full text of what you wrote on the right. At the top of the Notes app is a toolbar that allows you to, from left to right: show or hide folders, view attachments, delete a note, write a new note, create a checklist, apply a text style, add a photo or video, add or remove a password lock, and share and search notes. To create a note, click the new note button or use the Command + N keyboard shortcut. Notes also include the ability to attach photos or videos. This can prove very useful when trying to remember what inspired you. When you want to attach a photo or video to a note, just drag them over the note. For example, if you used the Notes app to create a grocery list, you can remember to buy cat food and make it particularly convincing with a picture of your hungry kitten attached. When you're done with a note – say you've been able to bring your brilliant, ingenious idea – you can delete it. Select the note and click the Recycle Bin icon, or simply press the Delete key. If you make a mistake and want to resurrect a note, you can go to the Recently Deleted Items folder and drag it back to the Notes folder. You can drag unlocked notes to any other folder you have created, but locked notes can only be dragged into folders associated with your Mac. you can submit all your notes in clean categories. To create a new folder, simply click + in the lower-left corner of the folder window or use the Shift + Command + N keyboard shortcut. or iPad. You can move note folders, for example, from my Mac folder to iCloud and vice versa, but you can't move notes folders (such as in the previous example) from the Mac or iCloud folder to your Google notes folder. Additionally, you cannot move default folders such as Notes folders or Recently Deleted Folders, only folders for custom notes that you create. How to view attachments Let me be silent for a moment to talk about attachments. Over time, you can add quite a few attachments to your notes, and sometimes you may forget which attachment is associated with a specific note. Fortunately, if you click the View Attachments button, you can see all your attachments by selecting a different category in one convenient location. Do you want to see the note that a picture, document, or Web site is attached to? No problem, just right click on it and select Go to Note. You can also access the attachment browser using the Command +1 keyboard combination. How to make a note private To lock a note, you must first select a note that you want to lock, and then click the lock icon on the toolbar. You'll create a password for all locked notes, so you'll need to enter a password, confirm it, and then, if you want, a hint to help you remember your password. Remember that this password will extend to all the notes you lock from here, so it might be a good idea to create a hint just in case. You will only need to run this initial password creation once. From then on, every time you want to lock a new or existing unlocked note, you'll just select it, click the lock icon, and enter your lock password. If you lock a note, keep in mind its title can still be seen: its contents will be protected. If you want to close all your notes at once, click the lock icon again and select Close all locked notes. This will ensure that you do not accidentally leave open. How to use notes for iOS Let's have the next note conversation on iPhone and iPad that sports many of the same features, including a cool annotation feature that literally lets you create handwritten notes. The Notes app on your iPhone or iPad is not likely to throw you for a cycle. It has almost the same functionality as the OS X Notes app. We start with the folder view, which has the necessary Folders All iCloud, Notes and Recently Deleted Folders, as well as synchronized Things to remember folder that we created earlier. If you want to make changes, you can press the New Folder button in the lower-right corner. Tapping Edit will allow you to delete multiple folders, or you can simply swipe left through a separate folder to delete it. Note that you cannot make and change three default folders. We'll tap the Notes folder to climb all our notes synced between our Mac and all our iOS devices via iCloud. Any device that's registered to your iCloud account will sync your notes unless you turn off syncing notes. At the bottom of the app there is a button to create a new note or access attachments as we talked in the first part. Tap the Edit button and select bubbles will appear along with each note. You can then move or delete the notes en masse. Alternatively, swipe left to move or delete individual notes. Open a note and notice the toolbar at the bottom. From left to right, you have delete buttons, make a checklist, attach a photo or video, ananoty a note, and create a new note. If you tap the camera icon, you can attach a photo or video from your library or pick up a new one. Let's check out the annotation tool. You'll have a choice of several tools that will allow you to write notes using a pen, pencil, or marker, as well as measure, delete, or choose a different color. Just like in OS X, you can make notes in person. How to make a note in person To lock a note on your iPhone or iPad, first select your note, and then tap the Share icon and you'll see the Note Lock button. When you press this button, you will be prompted to enter a password. After you enter a password, you just need to tap the lock icon on the toolbar. Once you're locked, you can enter your password or use a touchID fingerprint to unlock it. This will work on both platforms, so if you lock a note on your Mac, you can unlock them on your iPhone and vice versa.
